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This month, 49 years

ago,.....one of the most significant, soul destroying events in Australian motoring occurred.

An article was published in the Sydney based *The Sun-Herald* newspaper on the 25 June 1972, drafted by motoring journalist Evan Green entitled "*160 MPH 'Super Cars' Soon*". It highlighted, General Motors-H, Ford Australia and Chrysler Australia were each about to produce new models, based on family saloons and capable of top speeds up to 160 mph (257 km/h) (*maybe not the H...Torana*). Each manufacturer was required to sell to the general public at least 200 units of their respective models, making the cars eligible for Bathurst under Group E Series Production regulations.

The models prototyped were: a 320 bhp (239 kW), 308ci/5.0 L V8-engined version of the Holden LJ Torana GTR XU-1 (2??); the Ford XA Falcon GTHO Phase IV powered by a 400 bhp (298 kW) 351ci/5.8 L V8 engine; and an upgraded version of the Chrysler VH Valiant Charger R/T E49 fitted with a 300 bhp (224 kW) 265ci/4.3 L Hemi-6 engine, now with a 4 speed gear box! Power figures are speculative but consistent with what is regarded close to where each manufacturers aspirations were aiming for, the Phase IVs are under prescribed....!??...ED.

A slow news day on the 25 June 1972 (the front page photo of the Sun-Herald features a kid playing in a fountain contaminated by washing powder....) and the Evan Green story on these new 'Supercars' provided the Editor enough incentive to project the motoring article from back of the classifieds to the front page of that days Sun-Herald. The article was further enhanced with a quote from New South Wales Transport Minister, Milton Morris, saying that he was appalled that these cars - which he labelled "bullets on wheels" are being sold to ordinary motorists and "if manufacturers are making these supercars available to the general public because this is a condition of eligibility for the Bathurst 500, then I think it is imperative that race organisers closely examine their rules." Green went on to say, "the models would introduce new standards of handling and control in Australian high performance cars and he quoted HDT boss Harry Firth as saying that the proposed Torana V8 model would be "the best handling, safest car on the road." This was pre RTS at GM-cough cough H...ED!





On the following Wednesday, Morris said he would "seek a national ban on such cars" and the following day, the Queensland Minister of Transport, Mr Hooper joined in calling for a "national ban on the registration of popular make high-performance cars capable of speeds in excess of 130 mph". In another announcement on that Thursday, Mr D Thomson, secretary of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport, stated that regulations would be changed to discontinue all series production car races and allow manufacturers to race specially modified race vehicles derived from a production vehicle. This heralded the death of the race cars for the road and the Group C category was born.

While there was government outrage that the "Big Three" were to produce such supercars for public sale in Australia, it was pointed out that those who could afford to do so could still buy high powered imported sports cars, such as those made by Ferrari, Porsche and Jaguar that came with performance capabilities that rivalled or surpassed the proposed Australian cars. While these cars were somewhat more expensive to buy in Australia, it was argued that drivers had as much chance of having a fatal accident in a high powered import as they did in an Australian-made car.....this did not influence the Politicians attack on the *general public*. 'Ban low performance drivers,...NOT High Performance CARS' became a common re-buttle to mute politicians.

From the ashes of the 'Super Car scare', at least Ford created four Phase IVs.....which, I am sure, you are familiar with each of their story'sone only production car, with GT HO on the compliance plate and name plaque inside,... painted green ("GREEN is Nice!"), and three prototype/race cars, of which one supposedly died through altercation with a commonnadore......towing a caravan!.....Bugger!


