The VAILO Adelaide 500 has just concluded with some great results achieved by Ford teams, with a clean sweep of the podium on Sat and a one, three for the Penrite Mustangs on the Sunday. The best news, Van Gisbergan finished second to Kostecki for the Championship!

The season will be remembered as the *Camaro Cup*! Long suffering Holden fans (Supercars) got what they wanted, with Camaro dominating the championship and winning Bathurst. As the Mustangs gained concessions, only at the end of the season, the 'swings and roundabouts' formula of Supercars,.....is a joke!

The hope for all is the wind tunnel testing achieves the 'aero parity!??!' amongst the Mustang and Camaro; however, this still discounts the engines basic design. GM with a single cam, OHV engine (that looks kind of like a Windsor with the electrics at the wrong end) and a quad cam, four valve Coyote,....with the VCT disabled!

Basically, the Ford engine is hobbled to match the LS, how sad. A recurring theme where the GM product is made to appear better through rules and regulations imposed on the other makes. History repeats.

### F.H.M.C. CLUB DELEGATES GENERAL MEETING NOTES

SATURDAY 14th October 2023 @ 2.00PM.

- WH&S was pointed out by the President.
- There have been many requests for the \$500 grant and most have been successful.
- The Treasurer's Report indicated a healthy financial balance.
- The Logbook Manager, Brian Davey, reiterated that some clubs are still not complying with mandatary requirements. Failure to fill out the Logbook Return Declaration Form is one of those mandatary requirements, where those clubs' failure to do so will slow down the receival of any further logbooks for their club. There are still approximately 70 clubs that fall into this category. Another "no brainer" is that some clubs still think that they will receive their logbooks without prior payment. Logbook(s) will only be sent **out after full payment** has been received by the F.H.M.C.
- Because of an influx for Public Liability Insurance, through Gallagher Australia, the Historic Motoring Clubs Insurance Scheme, although the period of insurance, (1<sup>st</sup> October 20, 2023, has expired), clubs with existing insurance with Gallagher, will still be covered by Gallagher until the new application forms can be sent out to those clubs for renewal.
- Motorfest. 54 Entries. Starts on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> October. Total number of people 307, of which 67 are from interstate.
- Club Tour. Everything has been done. Starts 13<sup>th</sup> May 2024.
- At a recent event initiative generated by the Marion Council, the S.A. Police were in attendance. By invitation, they will attend any club meeting as a guest speaker and talk about various subjects. <u>www.police.sa.gov.au/road-safety</u>
- We were reminded that any club Constitution updates, once approved, a copy must be sent to the F.H.M.C. If at any time the club has a new committee, then that committee must be familiar with the "Code of Practice".
- National Conference-One body in S.A. Conference to be held at the Larges Pier Hotel S.A. next year. Transport Minister (DIT) yet to reply to invite, however, Sarah Clark has accepted the invitation as one of the guest speakers at this event.
- There was some discussion from the floor during general business, regarding whether insurance companies, involved with the Historic Motoring Clubs Insurance Scheme cover, for example, loading vehicles onto a truck and/or semi-trailer, to go to a show and/or maybe interstate. Waiting for further information regarding this scenario.
- During General Business discussions, realization that there exist varying premium costs from different Insurance Brokers/Agents, concerning Historic Motoring Clubs Insurance Scheme and what they will cover you for. One needs to be very careful, read the fine print, ask any questions that may concern you before you complete and pay for the policy. It should be noted that Public Liability and Committee cover through most "normal" Insurance Companies is generally a lot more expensive than the ones that specifically apply to Historic Vehicles.

The next meeting will be held on Saturday 25th November 2023 at 2.00pm.

<u>Groups are based on car speed and driver experience - there are no set rules (apart from Open Wheel),</u> <u>but please select the best fit based on the following examples:</u>

- Road Registered Standard road cars, less experienced drivers, day licences
- **Track Cars** Faster road cars, dedicated track day cars, slower race cars, clubmans, day licences and competition licences
- **Race Cars** Faster sedans, prototypes, clubmans, drivers with competition licences. Roll cage is not mandatory and road registered cars are allowed in this group.
- **Open Wheel** Open wheel race cars, prototypes, clubmans.

### **IMPORTANT UPDATE - DAY LICENCES**

Under Motorsport Australia rules, an Introductory Come & Try (Day) licence can only be used <u>ONCE</u> <u>PER YEAR</u> and is valid for a single event only.

Drivers who have already used a Day Licence in the current calendar year are required to purchase a Speed licence (or higher) to continue taking part in track days, or other events that require a Motorsport Australia licence.

# Shell V-Power Motorsport Park may decline the issue of a Day Licence to drivers that have already used one in the same calendar year.

Day licences will only be issued to drivers over 16 years of age, unless by prior approval.

- Minimum standard AS1698 or ECE22.03 Helmet required, or another standard complying with Level B (or higher) in Motorsport Australia <u>Schedule D</u>. Helmets are available for hire for \$50.
- Full length clothing (ankle to wrist) and enclosed, flat shoes must be worn.
- Vehicles must be roadworthy & fit for purpose. They must comply with Motorsport Australia <u>Schedule</u>
   <u>A & Schedule B</u> this includes the requirement for a <u>fire extinguisher</u> (available for hire for \$20). You will sign a disclaimer at sign on stating this.
- <u>ALL drivers will be required to hold a minimum Motorsport Australia Speed Licence. One day</u> <u>licences are available for purchase for \$25 and must be pre-booked with your entry.</u>
- Licences from other sanctioning bodies e.g. AASA are not accepted.
- Passengers are NOT permitted.
- Track days will not be affected by weather conditions & will proceed unless unsafe. In the unlikely event that we need to cancel or postpone an event we will contact you as soon as possible.
- Premium 98, E85 and ELF 102 race fuel is available on site.



The result of a A\$700 million development program, the EA Falcon remained an entirely Australian design and is credited as the first Falcon model to employ wind tunnel testing. Developed under the codename EA26 (E for the large size, A for Australia, 26 for the (usually in sequence) global project number), it would retain the traditional Falcon hallmarks of width and rear-wheel drive. This proved to be the correct move as sales of the Falcon began to climb after the fuel crisis aftermath, while those of the rival Holden Commodore slipped. It became clear that Australian buying patterns had not truly changed and what the public wanted was a full-size (albeit smaller) family car.

The EA series brought new 6 cylinder engines with across the board fuel injection, overhead camshaft cylinder head, inclined valve alloy heads and a low profile intake manifold lowering the engine height. Engine choice initially comprised three straight-six units starting with the base 3.2-litre EFI which utilised a throttle body injection (TBI) or central fuel injection (CFI) induction to give 90 kW (120 hp) at 4000 rpm and 235 N·m (173 lb·ft) at 3250 rpm. An extra cost option on the Falcon GL, and standard on Falcon S and Fairmont, the 3.9-litre EFI (commonly referred to as the CFI or TBI engine) increased stroke from 79 mm to 99.31 mm while bore remained at 91.86 mm. The engine used the same TBI as the 3.2-litre and power was rated at 120 kW (160 hp) at 4250rpm and torque 311 N·m (229 lb·ft) at 3250 rpm. Both these engines would be discontinued at the end of the EB Series 1. This left the 'gun' engine.

Standard on Fairmont Ghia and optional across the range was the multi-point injection (commonly referred to as "MPEFI") 3.9-litre. This utilised port injection along with a low profile intake manifold to increase outputs to 139 kW (186 hp) at 4250 rpm and 338 N·m (249 lb·ft) at 3500 rpm. The option was signified on vehicles by a "3.9 Multipoint" badge on each front fender behind the wheel arch was silver, except on Falcon S where it was red. On Falcon GL models the fitment of 215/65R14 tyres in place of either 185/75R14 (sedan) or 195/75R14 (wagon) tyres was also linked to the MPEFI option. All 30th Anniversary EA Falcons used a winged Falcon badge in the same fender location regardless of engine option causing there to be no obvious MPEFI identification.

A five-speed BorgWarner T50D fully synchronised manual and BorgWarner M51 three-speed automatic transmission were offered, however the latter was replaced by a four-speed M85LE in the Series II range.



The EA was never engineered to contain a V8 within it's engine bay. Due to the absence of a V8 engine and any sort of high performance model (Falcon S?), a GT model was not even scoped by Ford product planners at the time. As result of this short sightedness, the EA attracted significant interest from the Australian aftermarket industry hoping to gain Ford's approval for a factory backed model. Certain personalities and companies to try to court Ford as a performance partner included:

- Advanced Induction Technology ("AIT") offering intercooled turbo kits sold through many Ford dealers
- APV and their EA SR3900
- TSS
- AVO
- Wayne Draper (once Ford designer) EA Phase Autos HO Phase 7
- Mick Webb's EA SVO
- Dick Johnson's DJR EA Falcon, and an unlikely individual,.....
- Peter Brock and his EA B8.

Only a few progressed beyond prototypes to selling modified EAs through select Ford Dealers.



#### AVO

An Australian turbocharging company, AVO, built up a turbocharged EA falcon that held the world record for the fastest caravan tow, at 204.4 km (127.0 mi). These turbo kits were offered as an aftermarket accessory to existing owners of EAs.



Advanced Induction Technology ("AIT") One of the premium offerings for the EA Series wa the offering of intercooled turbo kits sold through many Ford dealers. The kit used a front mount intercooler fed by extra air vents in the bumper, turbocharger, extra injectors and was signified by a build plate and instrumentation markings.

#### TSS

The EA TSS was a series of options from body kit manufacture GP Sportscars. These cars were known for the option of a JDD Twin Tire system and Sprintex supercharger system. GP also manufactured a complete body styling kit, and interior package. As the TSS was a range of options, rather than a specific model, an interested owner could have a complete car optioned up, or just specific options. As a result; some featured either just the supercharged motor, or body kit.





#### **Special Vehicle Operations**

With over 1000 built, the EA SVO was the most successful aftermarket option. A creation from Australian motor racing driver and engineer Mick Webb, the EA SVO came with ROH 16-inch wheels, 'Recaro' seats, 'MOMO' steering wheels, suspension upgrades including 'Bilstein' Shock Absorbers, engine modifications, spoilers and two tone grey paint work.

#### **Peter Brock**

Peter Brock formed Austech Automotive Developments from the ashes of HDT to produce a selection of vehicles based on the Falcon S and Fairmont Ghia models. At the time, Brock recognised, a Ford Sierra was the only weapon to have in Group A, so it made sense to try and profit from his new found love for all things Ford! All Brock EA Falcons featured a unique body kit, 16inch wheel package and interior upgrades. The latter used the standard seats bolstered and trimmed in a cloth specific to the model. These were manufactured by a Geelong based company called Paratus, who would go on to supply Ford with performance seats for the EB models. Brock also improved the power output through a re-profiled camshaft, ECU tuning and modification to the induction and exhaust systems. A suspension upgrade was also performed, improving handling and ride quality.
