NEWS FROM FORD

FALCON GT- A CAR WITH A HERITAGE

The 25th Anniversary Falcon GT released today has a pedigree and heritage no other Australian car can match. The very name Falcon GT conjures up thoughts of a drive across the Hay Plains from Sydney to Adelaide for the Grand Prix, powering through the curves of Victoria's Great Ocean Road or cruising down Melbourne's Lygon Street on a Friday night.

The Falcon GT was born in 1967 when Ford's dynamic managing Director Bill Bourke saw the prototype of a police special being developed by the engineers at the company's You Yangs Proving Ground and suggested they develop a production version, paint them all one colour and call them GTs.

On April 18, 1967, Ford's General Sales Manager Keith Horner issued a Confidential Dealer Bulletin, Volume 18, No 11, headed "Falcon GT". The bulletin was short and to the point. The new model would be available in one colour "GT Gold" with charcoal trim, have a high-performance 4-barrel V8 with 225 hp., a floor mounted manual transmission with synchromesh on all four speeds, special suspension, wider rimmed wheels, radial ply tyres and a 16:1 steering ratio with power steering optional. The price? \$3,890 including sales tax!

The first Falcon GT was an instant success and the 596 units built between March 1967 and February 1968 sold like hot cakes. Seven GTs were entered for the Gallagher 500 at Bathurst and all finished with the Firth/Gibson car winning first time out.

With the new XT Falcon in 1968 came a new engine, the 302 cubic inch (4.9 litre) Windsor which boasted an extra five horsepower over the 289 Windsor and an increase in torque from 305 to 310 ft/lbs developed 600 rpm higher at 3800. Wheel rims were widened to 6", a limited slip differential was fitted as were driving lights, a front anti-roll bar and optional automatic transmission.

The most famous XT GT models were the three cars entered by Ford in the London-Sydney Marathon. Masterminded by Harry "The Fox" Firth, the team came home in 3rd, 6th and 8th places to take out the prestigious Teams Prize for Ford and Australia. Next year, Ford's Vice President, External Affairs Ian Vaughan, who drove KAGOO2 to third place in 1968, will drive the same car again in the re-run of this historic event. Between February 1968 and June 1969 a total of 1,415 XR GTs were built.

Have you driven a Ford ... lately?

In May 1969 the first of the famous XW GTs rolled off the Broadmeadows assembly line. Ford upped the ante with the XW by fitting the 351 cubic inch (5.8 litre) Windsor V8 with an advertised output of 290 bhp (217kW) and a massive 385 ft/lbs of torque. With bigger brakes, final drive ratio of 3.25:1, a huge 36 gallon (164 litre) fuel tank and suspension mods to take the extra power and torque, the XW seemed to be the ultimate grand tourer. But more was in store for the enthusiast.

The HO model which followed two months later was a real street racer. HO stood for "Handling Option" in Fordspeak but most of the modifications added by Ford racing boss Al Turner, were to the engine. The 351 got a bigger (650cfm) carburettor, hydraulic valve lifters, revised camshaft, heavy duty alternator, alloy inlet manifold as well as a three-inch heavy duty tailshaft, heavier front roll bar, beefed-up coils, stiffer shocks and a new rear roll bar.

In its first appearance at the 1969 Bathurst race a GTHO came in second in spite of the wrong tyre choice which saw the works cars pittong for unscheduled stops throughout the day. The GTHO also saw the debut of the "Super Roo" emblem, the tyre smoking kangaroo. Production of the XW model resulted in 2,287 GT models from May 1969 to October 1970 and 662 GTHOs from July 1969 to October 1970.

Ford further refined the XWGT with the Phase 2 GTHO which appeared in August 1970 and featured the Cleveland 351 engine with solid lifters, higher rev limit (6,500rpm) than the Windsor engine (5,500), a 780cfm Holley carburettor and improved gear ratios with a high 3.5:1 rear axle. Allan Moffat won Bathurst in a Phase 2 after leading from lap 2.

The new XYGT rolled off the production line in September 1970 followed in May 1971 with the classic GTHO Phase 3. Looking suitable aggressive with its "shaker" air intake protruding through the bonnet, rear deck spoiler and bold side stripes, the XYGTHO was fitted with a bigger radiator, larger harmonic balancer, better valve train, baffled sump and an extractor exhaust system. You could even choose between four rear axle ratios.

The 1971 Bathurst was a triumph for Ford with Phase 3 GTHOs finishing 1-2-3 and for the most-replayed sequence of Bill Brown's car recording the race's most spectcular crash as he rolled along the fence at McPhillamy Park.

There were 1,557 XYGTs made from September 1970 to December 1971 while a total of 300 GTHO models were built from May to November 1971.

Early in 1972 Ford released the all-Australian designed XA Falcon with the GT in both sedan and hardtop versions and featured 4-wheel disc brakes for the first time. Ford built 1,868 sedans from January 1972 to September 1973 and 891 hardtops between July 1972 and September 1973.

The XA GT was designed for wider appeal with its less aggressive look and creature comforts. It is best remembered for the model that never was - the GTHO Phase 4! Three prototypes were hand built at Ford's "Lot 17" race workshop and one production model made it down the Broadmeadows assembly line before the "Supercar" furore in the media stopped production.

The Phase 4 was to have had 340bhp (255kW) and around 400 ft/lbs of torque and a reported top speed of around 150mph (240kmh). The 'normal' GT continued in production and race teams made do with their Phase 3 XYs.

The last of this era of Falcon GT models was the XB and it was also the most prolific. From July 1973 until June 1976 Ford produced 1,950 sedans and 949 hardtop models. Many will argue that the XB was the best looking GT built by Ford, it was certainly the best "grand tourer" in the real sense of the word.

The XA GT won at Bathurst in 1973 with Moffat and Ian "Pete" Geoghegan in the hardtop version and again in 1974 with John Goss and Kevin Bartlett in the first really wet race on the mountain. The last, and possibly the most famous Falcon GT win in the classic race was the Moffat/Bond 1-2 victory in 1977 in the XB GT Moffat Dealer Team cars.

Many mourned the passing of the Falcon GT but it was already a legend in Australian motoring history. Although Ford built 400 pseudo GTs in 1979 - the Cobra Hardtop - it looked as though there would never be another Falcon GT when the V8 engine was dropped from Ford's line-up in November 1982.

When the Company announced the return of the V8 in July 1991 there was immediate speculation of a new GT and Ford showed a mock-up car at the Melbourne Motor Show in March 1992.

The release of the 25th Anniversary Falcon GT is another milestone in the legendary history of this famous model.


