





















Ford launched an all-new Falcon model in March 1979 with the XD/XE/XF range becoming hugely successfully throughout the 1980s, ultimately eclipsing Holden's Commodore as Australia's most popular family car.

The XD was sold in both sedan and station wagon versions, plus the usual commercials, while the model line-up consisted of the base Falcon GL, mid-range Fairmont and upmarket Fairmont Ghia, later joined by the stretched luxury Fairlane and LTD models. There was no GT, having been discontinued during the transition from XB to XC. Ford, in an effort to add some 'sizzle' to the line up, wanted to move away from the GT badge and attain a more sophisticated, European style of Grand Tourer.

Ford announced a high-performance model to spice up the XD range called the ESP (which stood for European Sports Pack), to evoke the spirit of the earlier GTs. Offering a unique colour palette, colour-coded grille, Marshal fog lamps, front spoiler and 15-inch Globe Bathurst alloy rims (developed for the XA GT-HO Phase IV and standard issue on the limited build XC Cobra) shod with low profile tyres. The list of features was more than just skin deep. Bilstein gas shock absorbers, heavy-duty anti-roll bars and stiffer springs improved the Falcon's handling, and the ESP came with four-wheel disc brakes, a limited-slip diff and quick ratio steering as standard. Under the bonnet, the ESP was equipped with Ford's 4.1-litre six, equipped with the much publicised cross flow alloy head, and a four-speed manual gearbox as standard. The V8 remained optional and could be had as either the 4.9 litre, or 5.8 litre Geelong cast Cleveland engines. Interior changes included Scheel front seats with cloth trim and full instrumentation. The ESP could be had as a GL, Fairmont or Fairmont Ghia; however, this was to


change with XE.











When Ford unveiled its revised XE Falcon range in March 1982 the ESP was now based exclusively on the more upmarket Fairmont Ghia, which meant more standard equipment. The appearance was improved with new pattern 15-inch alloys and more integrated body enhancements complemented by two-tone paintwork. With its new Watts link rear suspension set-up, the XE Falcon was a much nicer car to drive and compared favourably with the best European saloons of the day in contemporary road tests. The XE ESP was also available in 4.1, 4.9 or 5.8-litre versions, although the locally made Ford V8 was doomed, the final Australian V8-powered Falcon emerging from the Broadmeadows plant in November 1982, a silver Fairmont Ghia ESP with the 4.9 litre and 4 speed manual combination, complete with a gold plaque to signify that sad day.

A sad day indeed (despite the smiles in the above photo), a time when Ford (with the benefit of hindsight) dropped the performance market ball and gave it all to GM. It is rumoured, the Silver 4.9 litre ESP was not the final V8 built by Ford Australia, as Fairlanes, LTDs and even some special Fairmont Ghias left the factory after November 1982. Not to mention, Falcon GLs with the 5.8 litre V8 made specifically for Interceptor duty with state Police. At the very least, Ford lost a generation of motoring enthusiasts to GM, and did not gain traction till the arrival of the EB and the reintroduction of the now 5.0 litre Windsor in 1991.


